

CALL FOR RESOLUTIONS AND BY-LAW AMENDMENTS FOR DISCUSSION **AT THE 2020 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

Proposed changes to by-Laws and resolutions may be submitted by any member (local association or Friend of Community Living Ontario) as well as the Community Living Ontario Board and Council.

The deadline for submitting proposed resolutions or by-law amendments for discussion at the upcoming annual General Meeting is June 12, 2020.

Do not worry about putting your proposed resolution or by-law amendment into a specific motion. We can assist with the format after you submit your proposed changes. Simply let us know as clearly as possible what you think should be put forward for discussion and consideration. Provide a brief background note as to why you feel this is important.

Resolutions

You may submit proposed resolutions for discussion and consideration that do one of the following things:

- (a) Give direction or set limits on what means the Board of Directors may or may not use in the pursuit of Association goals;
- (b) Add, amend or repeal a social policy position being advocated by Community Living Ontario; or
- (c) Recognize the achievements and good work of members or external organizations, groups, or individuals.
