We are writing to you today to offer our congratulations on a hard-fought campaign during the recent Ontario General Election.

Whilst the results may not have been what you would have expected and hoped for, success in increasing the seat count and returning the Liberal Party to official party status cannot be understated.

As you may recall, we had previously written to you regarding possible solutions to the critical issues facing the Developmental Services sector, in particular the 52,000 adults with intellectual disabilities who are currently languishing on the Developmental Services (DS) waitlist in Ontario.

As part of the [#WaitingToBelong campaign](#), launched in 2024, Community Living Ontario, OASIS, their member agencies and others in the DS Sector have been actively working to bring attention to this matter.

We welcomed your commitment during the election to double ODSP rates. However, since 1993, successive Ontario governments, regardless of political party, have increased core funding to support agencies by less than 7%, while the cost of living has soared by over 60% over that same time.

Thousands of people with developmental disabilities are still stuck on waitlists or inappropriately in hospitals and long-term care facilities because our sector is under-resourced.

We understand that the next few weeks and months will be extremely busy for you, but we would welcome the opportunity to arrange a meeting either in person or virtually with you and/or your staff at your earliest convenience to discuss the critical issues impacting the developmental services (DS) sector and the people living with developmental disabilities we serve across the province.
